Why AtlasOA exists

Accreditation work is real work, and it should have real tools.

Every technical college, community college, and specialized institution runs the same loop every year: define outcomes, collect evidence, assess, close the loop, and produce a report for an accreditor. Most institutions run this loop on a mix of spreadsheets, shared drives, email chains, and one or two survey tools, and every year the whole workflow has to be reinvented because nothing lives in one place.

AtlasOA is the workspace for that loop. It stores outcomes, maps them to your accreditor's standards, collects evidence automatically where it can, scores with rubrics, tracks closing-the-loop actions, and produces the reports your accreditor actually wants. It runs on a server you own, so your evidence and student data never leave your network.

"Four things AtlasOA is designed to make easy" is the short version. Below is the grid.

Who AtlasOA is built for

Technical colleges

Single-campus or multi-campus institutions focused on workforce credentials and industry-aligned programs. AtlasOA maps cleanly to ACCSC and Council on Occupational Education standards.

Community colleges

Two-year institutions juggling transfer programs, workforce programs, and continuing education. AtlasOA supports HLC, SACSCOC, and WASC reporting.

Specialized institutions

Schools focused on a single domain such as healthcare, trades, or design. AtlasOA's custom outcome model fits specialty accreditors without forcing a generic shape on your programs.

Regional and private institutions

NECHE and WASC institutions that need a defensible, repeatable outcomes workflow without paying for an oversized enterprise platform.

How an assessment cycle runs in AtlasOA

1. Define

Programs set outcomes, map them to the accreditor's standards, and assign owners.

2. Plan

Each outcome gets an assessment plan with methods, measures, targets, and timing.

3. Collect

Evidence attaches automatically from connected systems. Anything that does not connect can be uploaded directly.

4. Score

Rubrics live in the system. Faculty score student work and results roll up automatically.

5. Close the loop

Results trigger discussion threads, action items, and follow-up plans. Everything is timestamped.

6. Report

One-click export for annual reports, program reviews, and full self-studies. The report pulls from live data.

EVIDENCE

Where evidence comes from

- LMS integration for Canvas, Blackboard, Moodle, D2L, and Schoology: course grades, rubric scores, and assignment artifacts attach to the right outcome.
- SIS integration for Banner, Colleague, Jenzabar, and PeopleSoft: enrollment, completion, and persistence data feeds institutional outcomes automatically.
- Direct upload for anything else: employer surveys, capstone portfolios, external certification results, and advisory board minutes.
- Manual entry for rubric-scored faculty assessments when the work happens outside a connected system.

EVIDENCE INTEGRITY

Every piece of evidence in AtlasOA is versioned, timestamped, and attributed. When an accreditor asks where a number came from, the answer is one click away and includes the original source, the date it was collected, and the person who reviewed it.

What comes out of AtlasOA

Annual outcomes report

A compact summary of every program and institutional outcome, its assessment method, its result, and the action taken. Perfect for board meetings and annual accreditor check-ins.

Program review packet

A full program review document with outcomes history, evidence, student demographics, completion data, and employer feedback. Ready for your program review committee.

Accreditation self-study

A structured self-study document mapped to your accreditor's standards, with evidence links embedded inline. The writing still belongs to your team, but the structure and data are already there.

Closing-the-loop report

A focused report on what results triggered action, what actions were taken, and what changed the next cycle. This is the document accreditors care about most.

Custom reports

Any data in AtlasOA can be pulled into a custom report using the built-in report builder. No SQL required.

Where AtlasOA lives

AtlasOA runs on a server you own. Typical deployment is a single Windows Server 2019 or 2022 (64-bit) host with 16 GB of RAM, 500 GB of SSD, and a modern x86 processor. Most institutions already have hardware that qualifies. We can recommend hardware if not.

Every piece of evidence, every outcome, every report, and every user record lives on your server. Nothing goes to a third-party cloud. Backups are under your control. Access policies are under your control. Your IT department gets full visibility into what the system is doing because it is running on their metal.

WHY ON-PREMISE MATTERS FOR ACCREDITATION

Accreditors care about the integrity of the data you submit. On-premise deployment makes that case easier: you can show exactly where the data lives, who has touched it, and how it is protected. No vendor handoff, no third-party subprocessor disclosures, no surprises.
